

WEBINO with Vertical Gaze Palsy - A Rare Syndrome Revisited

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Abstract

A 45 years old male presented to us with a history of sudden onset painless diplopia for the past two weeks. There was a previous history of cerebrovascular accident (CVA) three weeks back. Examination revealed bilateral internuclear ophthalmoplegia with vertical gaze anomaly and postural instability. A diagnosis of wall eyed bilateral

internuclear ophthalmoplegia (WEBINO) with probable progressive supranuclear palsy (PSP) was made. This is a very rare disorder; the ocular symptoms developing one week after a CVA plus PSP like signs and symptoms makes it a rarest of rare case.
